

XBRL in Belgium

- Early adopters in Belgium
 - **Olivier Servais**
 - consortium "XBRL in Europe" (2003-2004)
- Founding of XBRL Belgium
 - Non-profit organization created in November 2004
 - Became an Established Jurisdiction in 2006
 - Hosted by the National Bank of Belgium
 - Founding members:
 - Regulators: NBB, CBFA, CBN
 - Government: Belgian Ministries of Finance, ICT and Economy
 - Professional associations: BIBF, BVB, IAB, IBR
- Founding member of XBRL-Europe
 - European non-profit association according to Belgian law
 - Created in 2008



XBRL-BE: membership over the years

The Belgian building blocks approach




COREP and FINREP, RECAP

- **2005-2010**, CEBS₁ activities
 - XBRL workshops of CEBS and start of the "XBRL Network"
 - Flaboration of XBRI frameworks for FINREP and COREP
 - Creation of the "Eurofiling" initiative, meeting place between supervisors and other stakeholders in the XBRL reporting process
- **01.01.2011** EBA₂ takes over the responsibilities of CEBS
 - 20.12.2011 EBA publishes consultation paper CP50 on draft Implementing Technical Standards on supervisory reporting requirements for institutions (CRD IV)
 - 27.03.2012 Official start of EBA XBRL Sub Group
- **2012** elaboration of new FINREP/COREP frameworks based on integrated data modeling and taxonomy creation
- (1) Committee of European Banking Supervisors
- (2) European Banking Authority



FINREP in Belgium

- "Financial Reporting" (FINREP)
 - Consolidated Quarterly reporting for ~20 credit institutions
 - 30.03.2005: Belgian FINREP schema (XML)
 - 12.08.2005: Belgian FINREP taxonomie
 - 01.01.2006: First mandatory Belgian XBRL reporting
 - 01.01.2007: First European Taxonomy >>> BE extension
 - Still in production today
 - Difficult to compare with other national FINREPs



COREP in Belgium

- "Common Reporting of the new Solvency ratio" (COREP)
 - Based on Basel II capital agreements
 - Transposed in XBRL by CEBS
 - Belgian extension for national discretion purposes
 - Covers prudential reporting on capital, credit risk, market risk, operational risk and large exposures risk
 - ±150 financial institutions (of which: 50% Credit Institutions)
 - 01.01.2007: COREP is optional (10% chooses to adopt)
 - 01.01.2008: COREP (CRD I) becomes mandatory
 - 31.12.2010: CRD II lead to new extension
 - 31.12.2011: CRD III lead to new extension



COREP and **FINREP** in Belgium, conclusion

- **Lessons learned after 6 years of XBRL reporting**
 - Changes are quickly adopted by market participants: XBrL=XbRL
 - It is good practise to harmonise between Europeans
 - Increasing adherence to the European frameworks
 - Taxonomy effort is going more and more to Europe
 - **Cross-border operating companies benefit**
 - We are not there yet
 - **National discretions**
 - XBRL = part of the chain
 - XBRL may look difficult, but it is really not
 - At the doorstep: XBRL rendering and XBRL Formulae = missing link!
 - Would we do it again? Yes, we would.
